India-Singapore explore boosting ties across 'six pillars' at key bilateral dialogue

SINGAPORE, AUG 26/--/ Senior ministers from India and Singapore held a "productive" round of discussions at the second multi-ministerial roundtable here and explored how the two countries can boost bilateral cooperation in digital, skill development, sustainability, healthcare, connectivity and advanced manufacturing.

The four-member Indian delegation comprising Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal, and Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw participated in the second India-Singapore Ministerial Roundtable (ISMR) to discuss bilateral cooperation and exchange views on issues of mutual interests.

"During the meeting, the leaders emphasised ways of further #enhancing cooperation between India and Singapore in #emerging and #futuristic areas," India's Ministry of Finance said in a post on X.

At the roundtable, the four leaders, led by

Sitharaman, were joined by their Singaporean counterparts and reviewed the progress from the first ISMR held in New Delhi in September 2022. The ISMR is being held here ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's likely visit to the city-state next month.

Both sides deliberated upon the six pillars identified under ISMR, which include "digitalisation, skill development, sustainability, healthcare and medicine, and advanced manufacturing and connectivity", according to the post.

"The leaders also discussed plans for commemorating the 60th Anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and Singapore, alongside regional and global cooperation, including #ASEAN & #G20 developments," it said.

"The leaders noted that the discussions in the 1st round of #ISMR have resulted in the successful conclusion of MoUs on Healthcare, Education & Skill Development, Digital Cooperation and Semiconductor Ecosystem

Cooperation," it said.

"A productive 2nd India-Singapore Ministerial Roundtable today. We explored cooperation in digital, skill development, sustainability, healthcare, connectivity and advanced manufacturing," Jaishankar said in a post on X.

Jaishankar also thanked the Singaporean delegation, led by Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade and Industry Gan Kim Yong, for their commitment to deepening the India-Singapore partnership. He added that the ISMR "enables the emergence of a more contemporary partnership".

The Singaporean delegation comprised of Minister for Foreign Affairs Dr Vivian Balakrishnan, Minister for Home Affairs Josephine Teo, Minister for Manpower and Second Minister for Trade and Industry Dr Tan See Leng, and Minister for Transport and Second Minister for Finance Chee Hong Tat.

The four ministers also

called on Singapore President Tharman Shanmugaratnam and Prime Minister Lawrence Wong during their visit and discussed ways to further take forward the bilateral strategic partnership.

During the meeting with President Tharman, the leaders discussed "boosting the India-Singapore Strategic Partnership by focusing on key areas like #digitalisation, #GreenInitiatives, and #SkillDevelopment," the Finance Ministry said in a post on X after the meeting.

It said that Sitharaman appreciated President Tharman for being a "strong proponent of multilateralism through his seminal contribution to developing far-reaching reforms that can enable governments and institutions to deal with 21st-century challenges".

She also expressed gratitude for his invaluable contributions as a member of the G20 Expert Group on Strengthening Multilateral Development Banks during India's G20 Presidency last year. "Honoured to jointly call on President @Tharman_S of Singapore.

Conveyed the warm greetings of President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister @narendramodi. Value his guidance on ways to further take forward the India-Singapore Strategic Partnership," Jaishankar said in a post on X after the meeting. Goyal also took to X and said that their discussions aimed at deepening the "strong economic ties between our nations, driving growth and enhancing collaboration across key sectors." The four ministers also called on Prime Minister Wong. "Delighted to call on Prime Minister @LawrenceWongST of Singapore today morning along with my colleagues @nsitharaman, @PiyushGoyal and @AshwiniVaishnaw. We conveyed the warm greetings of PM @narendramodi. Appreciate PM Wong's continued engagement with the India-Singapore Ministerial Roundtable," Jaishankar said in a separate post on X.

The ISMR is a unique mechanism established to set a new agenda for India-Singapore bilateral relations. (PTI)

Forest dept using elephant dung, urine to ward off killer wolves in UP's Bahraich

BAHRAICH (UP), AUG 26/--/The Forest Department in UP's Bahraich district is utilising elephant dung and urine to drive away a pack of wolves that has been terrorising the Mahsi tehsil.

The wolves are believed to have been responsible for multiple attacks and the death of five children in the area in the last 40 days.

IFS officer from Barabanki, Akashdeep Badhawan, who is leading the special operation, said, "We identified six wolves using high-frequency drone cameras. Out of these, three have already been captured. Our primary goal is to ensure the safety of villagers by first driving the wolves away from residential areas."

The impacted area falls in the Terai region with dense forests in the northern reaches of the district, which also shares an international border with Nepal. Badhawan said the strategy put in place includes using elephant dung and urine from the Katarniaghat forest.

"The dung is set afire to create a scent that simulates the presence of elephants. Wolves, which are pack hunters, tend to avoid large animals like elephants. "By creating this

illusion, we aim to push them away from inhabited areas. We have also set up traps with bait in remote areas," he said.Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Ajit Pratap Singh said the wolves have been attacking about two dozen villages in Mahsi tehsil since March.

"Over the past 40 days, there have been approximately 30 attacks, resulting in the deaths of five children and injuries to more than 30 people. We have managed to capture three wolves, which have been relocated to various zoos.

Attacks have intensified since July," Singh added.Singh said the wolves follow a specific pattern as they attack children sleeping in their homes and drag them to secluded areas to kill and consume their body parts. Recently, the wolves have altered their attack timings following the increased night patrols by the Forest Department, police and local residents, he noted.

In response to the situation, police, administration and local teams are conducting round-the-clock patrols.

BJP MLA Sureshwar Singh has joined the night patrols and is advising the villagers to keep their children indoors and patrol in groups. "I am

participating in the patrols and holding village meetings to boost morale. We are encouraging residents to remain vigilant and take necessary precautions," Singh said.

Chief Conservator of Forests (Central Zone) Renu Singh, who visited the affected areas, instructed the Forest Department to expedite the rescue efforts.

"We are intensifying our rescue operations and ensuring that all necessary measures are taken to protect the villagers," she said. Regarding the recent death of eight-year-old Khushboo, whose body was partially consumed by animals, Singh expressed concerns over the investigation. "There are discrepancies in the manner of her death. The body was found with the clothes removed, which raises questions about the investigation's thoroughness," Singh said.(PTI)

Non-compliance with SNJPC proposals: Chief secretaries of 18 states, UTs to appear in SC

NEW DELHI, AUG 26/--/ The chief secretaries of 18 states and UTs are scheduled to appear personally on Tuesday before the Supreme Court which has summoned them for non-implementation of the Second National Judicial Pay Commission's (SNJPC) recommendations on payment of pension arrears and retirement benefits to judicial officers.

The top-most bureaucrats of Tamil Nadu, Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Assam, Nagaland, Meghalaya, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh, Jharkhand, Kerala, Bihar, Goa, Haryana and Odisha have to be present before the apex court in person on August 27. A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra has listed the plea of the All India Judges Association and 22 other similar petitions for hearing at 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, according to the apex court website. "I can see there is no substantive compliance. They will have to personally appear before us or we will issue non-bailable warrants (NBW) against them," the CJI observed on August 22.

The direction came

when senior lawyer K Parmeswar, who is assisting the court as amicus curiae (a friend of court), had told the bench that despite several orders and the extension of time, as many as 18 states and Union territories (UTs) have not complied with the SNJPC recommendations fully.

The All India Judges Association (AIJA) is seeking implementation of welfare and other measures for former judges and judicial officers.

The bench said the top bureaucrats will have to appear personally to explain the delay and rejected the request of various states that the chief secretaries be permitted to appear virtually.

On July 11, the bench had summoned the chief secretaries of 23 states for non-compliance with the SNJPC recommendations on August 23. The amicus later informed the court that five more states have complied with the directions in the meantime.

As the three-judge bench headed by the CJI was not available on August 23, the officials will now have to appear on August 27.

While expressing strong displeasure over non-compliance, the bench had said, "We know how to

extract compliance now. If we just say that the chief secretary will be present if the affidavit is not filed then it will not be filed.

"We are not sending them to jail but let them be here and then an affidavit will be submitted. Let they be personally present now," the bench had said.

Though seven opportunities have been granted to the states, it appears that full compliance has not been given effect to and several states are in default, it had said. The bench had made it clear that it will not grant any more extension to the states. On January 10, the top court had said in its verdict that there was a need to maintain uniformity in the service conditions of judicial officers across the country. It had ordered constitution of a two-judge committee in each high court for overseeing the implementation of SNJPC

recommendations on pay, pension and other retirement benefits for judicial officers.

The top court had said it was a matter of grave concern that though officers in other services have availed of a revision of their conditions of service as far back as on January 1, 2016, similar issues pertaining to judicial officers are still awaiting a final decision eight years thereafter.

It said many judges have retired from service and the family pensioners of those who have passed away are awaiting resolution as well.

The SNJPC recommendations cover pay structure, pension and allowances. The commission has also dealt with the issue of establishing a permanent mechanism to determine subjects of service conditions of the district judiciary. (PTI)

Thangalaan' star Vikram calls incidents of crime against women ‘disgusting’

MUMBAI, AUG 26/--/Women need to feel safe at any odd hours or place and the onus on men to give them their space, says South star Vikram, who termed the recent incidents of crime against women in the country "disgusting". The 58-year-old actor's remarks come in the wake of the alleged rape and murder of a female doctor in Kolkata and the Justice Hema Committee report on women's exploitation in Malayalam cinema.

"All women need to feel protected. They should be able to walk the streets at 3.00 in the morning and feel they can walk, go home, and that nobody will do anything. That every man is there to protect them, to give them their space. It's disgusting what's happening," Vikram told PTI.
