## Sitharaman delivers longest Budget speech; peppers it with Kashmiri verse, populist measures

New Delhi, Feb 1 /--/ A Kashmiri verse, quotes from Tamil poets and references to Saraswati-Sindhu civilisation dotted Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's 160-minute long marathon Budget speech today which was cut short at the fag end after she felt unwell. As the minister, clad in a bright yellow sari with a light green border, delivered the longest Union Budget speech ever, some of her remarks, including regarding Beti Bachao Beti Padoos programme, were met with protests from the Opposition benches. Her first Budget speech, in July 2019, went on for around 137 minutes.

Apart from a Kashmiri verse, which she rendered in both Kashmiri and Hindi, the minister also quoted poets Thiruvalluvar and Kalidasa, among others. Many of the announcements including reduction in personal income tax rates were welcomed with thumping of desks by treasury benches. Prime Minister Narendra Modi too joined the members in the applause. Aspirational India, economic development for all and caring society were the prominent themes around which the Budget has been

woven, she said. After around 150 minutes, Sitharaman appeared tired and sipped water at least three before cutting short her speech.



In between when a staff member went to get a glass of water, Sitharaman took a candy that was offered by Union minister Nitin

Gadkari. Ministerial colleague Harsimrat Kaur Badal also came to the finance minister's place and offered a candy. Union ministers Rajnath Singh and Amit Shah were also seen talking to her. Unable to continue, she told the Speaker to consider the rest of the speech as laid and sat in her seat. Soon after the proceedings were adjourned, Prime Minister Narendra Modi walked up to her and greeted her. Several ministers, including Piyush Goyal and Smriti Irani, and various members, including from the

Congress, enquired Sitharaman about her health. Before leaving the House, Sitharaman waved at her family members who were standing in the gallery. Her daughter Vangmayi Parkala and three other family members were in the House for the speech. Congress President Sonia Gandhi and Samajwadi Party patriarch Mulayam Singh Yadav were among those conspicuous by their absence in the House. Rajya Sabha Deputy Chairman Harvansh Narayan Singh, and many other Upper House members, including Alphons Kannanthanam and Vaiko, were sitting in the gallery. (PTI)

## Jamia prohibits students from holding protests inside campus, warns of strict action

NEW DELHI, FEB 1 /--/ Jamia Millia Islamia today prohibited students from holding any protest meeting or agitation inside the university campus, warning them of strict action, according to officials. The varsity administration also directed students to report to it any unauthorised entry of outsiders in campus to avoid "disruption of peace". The directive comes in wake of recent incidents around the university area. Earlier this week, a student of the varsity was injured outside the campus when a man fired a pistol at a group of anti-CAA protesters before walking away while waving the firearm over his head shouting "Yeh lo aazadi". "Any kind of protest meeting, agitation, speeches and mass gathering or any unlawful activities causing inconvenience and disruption in the day to day academic functioning are not allowed around the central canteen or anywhere in the Jamia Millia Islamia campus," the Jamia Registrar said in an official order. "Students are expected to cooperate actively in discipline maintenance to support exam and conduct of classes. They are also expected to immediately report any outsider or unauthorised campus entry as this can lead to an attempt of disruption of peace at university. Strict action will be initiated if anyone is found engaged in such activities," the registrar added. The university had virtually turned into a battlefield last month as police entered the campus and also used force, following protest against the Citizenship Amendment Act, that led to violence and arson in which four DTC buses, 100 private vehicles and 10 police bikes were damaged. The university moved court this month for registration of FIR against Delhi police. (PTI)

## Man fires 2 rounds in air in Shaheen Bagh area during anti-CAA protest; arrested

New Delhi, Feb 1 /--/ A man today fired two rounds in air in the Shaheen Bagh area in Jamia Nagar, where an anti-CAA protest is on, following which he was taken into custody by police, eyewitnesses said. No one was injured in the incident which occurred at around 5 pm. This is the second time this week that an armed man has entered the site where the protest against the Citizenship (Amendment) Act has been going on since over a

month. According to eyewitnesses, the man, who identified himself as Kapil Gujjar, opened fire close to the police barricades, nearly 250 metres behind the stage. He was overpowered by police personnel and taken into custody. "The accused fired in air near police barricades. He was overpowered by police personnel and taken into custody. Further investigation is on," said Chinmoy Biswal, deputy commissioner of police

(southeast) said. "Only Hindus will get to call the shots in our country and nobody else (Hamare desh mein sirf Hinduon ki chalegi). Aur kisi ki nahi chalegi," the man shouted while he was being taken into custody. Abu Ala Suhani, a publisher and resident of Shaheen Bagh said: "The man appeared to be in his 20s and fired two rounds. While he was being taken into custody, we heard a policeman asking him his name. The man said his name was

Kapil Gujjar and he belongs to Dallupura village in Uttar Pradesh." He shouted "Hindu Rashtra Zindabad" and fired two rounds. Police said that they are verifying his identity. The incident comes days after a local contractor armed with a gun had come to the site and asked the people to end the protest. On Thursday, a youth had fired on anti-CAA protesters at Jamia Millia Islamia injuring a student. (PTI)

## MHA gets Rs 1.67 lakh cr; emphasis on police, census

NEW DELHI, FEB 1 /--/ The Union Home Ministry was allocated Rs 1,67,250 crore for the next fiscal with a special emphasis on police forces and works related to Census 2021. This allocation of the home ministry Budget includes those funds earmarked for the eight Union Territories (UTs) like the newly created Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh, which were given Rs 30,757 crore and Rs 5,958 crore respectively, according to the Union Budget presented in the Lok Sabha today by finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman. As the works for the Census 2021 has begun, the government has allocated Rs 4,568 crore under the Census Surveys and Statistics head. The house listing phase of the Census and the National Population Register will be carried out from April 1 to September 30, 2020. The Census will have its reference date as March 1, 2021, but for snow-bound Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand, it will be October 1, 2020. The Union Cabinet has already approved Rs 3,941.35 crore for the NPR exercise. The Budget

allocated Rs 1,126.62 crore for relief on account of natural calamities and Rs 842.45 crore for social security and welfare schemes. The lion's share of the Home Ministry Budget has gone to the paramilitary forces with the total allocation of Rs 92,054.53 crore for 2020-21. The allocation to the paramilitary forces will be distributed proportionately to the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), which is engaged in anti-militancy operations in Jammu and Kashmir, the north-east and often deployed for internal security duties, and the Border Security Force, which guards the Indo-Pak and Indo-Bangladesh borders. The other forces which will also get funds from the Home Ministry are the Indo-Tibetan Border Police, the Central Industrial Security Force, the Sashastra Seema Bal, the Assam Rifles and the National Security Guard. Rs 3,688.10 crore has been earmarked as grants-in-aid to the state governments, Rs 1,001.30 crore as grant-in-aid to the Union Territory administrations and Rs 195 crore for works related to the north-

eastern regions. Rs 1140.38 crore has also been earmarked for expenses of the Council of Ministers. The Budget also earmarked Rs 25,000 crore for the National Disaster Relief Fund (NDRF), which provides assistance to the states whenever there are natural calamities. The money is given from the NDRF funds to states for calamities like floods, draught, cyclone, unseasonal rains, hailstorm and quakes. Interestingly, just Rs 10,000 crore was earmarked for the NDRF in 2019-20. In addition, Rs 30,757 crore has been earmarked for the newly created Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, Rs 5,958 crore for Ladakh, Rs 5,164.26 crore earmarked for Andaman and Nicobar Islands, and Rs 4,635.10 for Chandigarh. The recently merged UT Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu has been earmarked Rs 2,180.52 crore and Lakshadweep has been given 1,349.71 crore in the Budget 20-21, Rs 1,116 crore has been given to Delhi and Rs 1,703.02 crore to Puducherry. ## Over Rs 17,300 cr allocated to MEA; 100 cr earmarked for strategic Chabahar Port

NEW DELHI, FEB 1 /--/ Over Rs 17,300 crore has been allocated for the ministry of external affairs in the Budget, with Rs 100 crore earmarked for the strategic Chabahar Port project in southeastern Iran that gives India connectivity to Afghanistan bypassing Pakistan. The total aid to countries has decreased by about Rs 56 crore from Rs 6,963 revised estimates of 2019-20 to Rs 6,907 crore in Budget 2020-21. While Nepal saw a cut of Rs 400 crore in aid by India from Rs 1,200 crore in 2019-20 to Rs 800 crore in 2020-21, Myanmar saw a hike in allocation from Rs 170 crore in 2019-20 to Rs 300 crore for the next fiscal. The aid for the strategically-important Chabahar Port which was zero in the revised estimates of 2019-20 has gone up to Rs 100 crore for the next fiscal. The Port complex, backed by India, on Iran's coast along the Gulf of Oman is being developed to provide an alternative trade route between India and Afghanistan.

In May 2016, India and Iran signed a bilateral agreement under which India would refurbish one of the berths at Shahid Beheshti Port, and reconstruct a 600-metre-long container handling facility at the port. The aid allocation for Bhutan has gone up from Rs 2,674.51 crore in 2019-20 to Rs 2,884.65 crore in the next fiscal. Aid allocation to Maldives has been reduced by Rs 75 crore to Rs 1,025 crore in the next fiscal. In the budget 2020-21, aid allocation for African countries is Rs 350 crore, Rs 200 crore for Bangladesh and Sri Lanka, Rs 140 crore for Seychelles, Rs 20 crore for Latin American countries and Rs 2 crore to Mongolia. The revised budget for 2019-20 showed that Rs 188 crore was spent for maintenance of aircraft of Air India for VVIP travel, and for the next fiscal year, Rs 150 crore has been allocated for it. The total allocation to the ministry in 2020-21 stands at Rs 17,346.71 as compared with the revised budget FY 2019-20 of Rs 17,372.27 crore. (PTI)

## Another Nirbhaya gangrape convict files mercy petition

NEW DELHI, FEB 1 /--/ Akshay Thakur, one of the convicts in the 2012 Nirbhaya gangrape and murder case, today filed a mercy plea, jail officials said. Thakur and three other convicts were to be hanged on Saturday but a city court indefinitely postponed their hanging. "Akshay Thakur filed a mercy plea before President Ram Nath Kovind on Saturday," Director General (Prison) Sandeep Goel said. Earlier in the day, the President rejected the mercy plea of another

accused, Vinay Sharma. The 23-year-old physiotherapy intern, who came to be known as 'Nirbhaya' (fearless), was gangraped and savagely assaulted on the night of December 16, 2012, in a moving bus in South Delhi. She died of her injuries a fortnight later in a Singapore hospital. Six people -- Mukesh, Vinay, Akshay Kumar Singh, Pawan Gupta, Ram Singh and a juvenile -- were named as accused. The trial of the five adult men began in a special fast-track court

in March 2013. The prime accused, Ram Singh, allegedly committed suicide by hanging himself in Tihar jail days after the trial began. The juvenile, who was said to be the most brutal of the attackers, was put in a correctional home for three years. He was released in 2015 and sent to an undisclosed location amid concerns over a threat to his life. The juvenile, when released, was 20 years old. Mukesh, Vinay, Akshay and Pawan were convicted and sentenced to death in September 2013. (PTI)

## Kamra sends legal notice to IndiGo demanding apology, revocation of 6 month ban

NEW DELHI, FEB 1 /--/ Days after IndiGo banned Kunal Kamra for a six-month period for allegedly heckling journalist Arnab Goswami on a flight, the comedian has sent a legal notice to the airline demanding an unconditional apology, revocation of the ban and Rs 25 lakh compensation. In the notice sent to the airline on Friday, Kamra's lawyer stated that his client has suffered "mental pain and agony" due to "illegal, arbitrary and high-handed decision" of the airline. Kamra was banned by IndiGo for six months on Tuesday for allegedly harassing the Republic TV Editor on its Mumbai-Lucknow flight.

the matter. An IndiGo statement on Saturday said, "The company will duly respond to any legal notice that it receives in relation to this matter." Kamra has given IndiGo one week's time to respond to the legal notice, accessed by news agency PTI. While aviation regulator DGCA had on



Wednesday stated that the action by the four carriers is in "complete consonance" with its regulations, the pilot-in-command of the Mumbai-Lucknow flight had told IndiGo management on Thursday that Kamra's actions were "unsavoury" but

not "unruly" and this incident was not "reportable in any way". Hours after the captain's letter to his management became public on Thursday, the Aviation minister justified IndiGo's action, stating that airlines must ensure 'zero tolerance' for any activity that has the potential to jeopardize passengers' safety. In the legal notice to IndiGo's CEO Ronjojoy Dutta, Kamra's lawyer Prashant Sivarajan said that Goswami -- against whom Kamra's "exchanges" were directed -- neither made any complaint nor requested the intervention of the cabin crew at any point of time during the flight. Kamra first came to know about his ban through the airline's post on Twitter on Tuesday night, Sivarajan said. "It was only subsequently the next day at 9.38 am that my client received an email from your consumer relations team officially intimating him about the six-month ban," said Sivarajan. (PTI)
